WHENEVER I HAVE MY SAY IT IS WELL. DON'T I MUST  
STOP. I DON'T WANT I HAD MY FIRST GOOD SLEEP 10 AM  
TO 4:30 AM. OF COURSE BREAKFAST AT 10 - 15

24 HOURS LATER:

DEAR. EVERY TIME THAT I THINK THAT I HAVE TIME  
TO WRITE A DECENT LETTER, THERE'S LACK OF TIME. MY  
MIND AND THOUGHTS ARE BECOMING CLAMORED WITH  
IDEAS AND NEW EXPERIENCES. YESTERDAY WHEN I STARTED  
THIS LETTER I WANTED TO GIVE YOU A QUICK SUMMARY  
OF RUN DOWN OF EVENTS AND EXPERIENCES SO FAR.  
HERE GOES AGAIN. - IF I CAN REMEMBER. NO NOTES

BECAUSE OF THAT PLANE RIDE WITH THE ENGINEERS  
I HAD NO SLEEP. I WAS WILDERLY TIRED SO I THOUGHT  
THAT I COULD SPEAK IN A POLE AT THE NATIONAL  
GALLERY. THERE I MET WATKINS AND BILL. BILL HAD AN  
IMPORTANT LUNCHEON DATE SO WATKINS AND I HAD  
LUNCH AND WENT TO THE AIRPORT TO LEAVE FOR  
COPENHAGEN. BILL WAS LATE. WE HAD ONE NIGHT IN  
COPENHAGEN AN EARLY NEXT MORNING 8:45 WE WERE  
AT "PERMANENTE" PERMANENTE " ANY WAY A BEAUTIFUL  
STORE OF SCANDINAVIAN FURNITURE AND CRAFTS. I  
SAW SO MANY BEAUTIFUL THINGS I WANTED TO BUY  
YOU, BUT WE ONLY HAD 15 MINUTES. WE WILL ORDER  
LATER.

we left "COPEN" at 11:30 AM AND ARRIVED IN MOSCOW AT 5:30 PM. IT WAS A PLEASANT TRIP. SAS ON THE PLANE WE MET WALTER HIPPMAN. (BY THE WAY LATER IN MOSCOW AT THE AMBASSADOR'S PARTY WE TALKED HE HE SHOULD VISIT YOU OR CALL YOU -

WHEN WE ARRIVED IN MOSCOW WE WERE TAKEN TO THE "SOVIETSPA" THE BEST IN MOSCOW THE "VIP" JOINT. OF COURSE THERE WERE ALL KINDS OF DIPLOMATS WITH MUCH GOING ON. I'M SURE THAT YOU HAVE READ. SO GUY WE MET IN MIDRASA, HEAD OF REUTERS REMEMBERED ME AND HE ASKED ABOUT YOU AND SENDS REGARDS TO SIR A, GAVE NAME "SIR CHANCERY". - GOT TO STOP -

8 HRS LATER MOSCOW'S WEATHER WASNT TO GOOD AT ALL - VISITS TO SCHOOLS MUSEUMS AND ARTISTS STUDIOS WERE THE MAIN EVENTS -

THE NIGHT OF THE EMBASSY DINNER WE HAD DINNER WITH MANY FOREIGN GUESTS AND TOOK THE LIGHT TRAIN TO LEVINGRAD - NEXT MORNING @ 8:30 AM WE WERE MET BY A DELEGATION FROM THE ARTIST UNION. SCHEDULE JUST ABOUT THE SAME WE DID QUITE A BIT OF SIGHT SEEING. LEVINGRAD IS MUCH MORE COLORFUL THAN MOSCOW - THE MANY CANALS AND BRIDGES MAKE ONE FEEL OF VENICE. THE SQUARES ARE VERY LARGE. IT IS A BEAUTIFUL CITY WE HAD RAIN SNOW AND SUN. THE PLANE TRIP TO THE UKRAINE WAS 6 HRS. KIEV WAS VERY INTERESTING. MANY CHURCHES AND MONASTRIES. PHOTOGRAPHS

WE LEFT KIEV 7:30 AM AND MADE SEVERAL STOPS AND ARRIVED IN GEORGIA. TBILISI. HERE A VERY YOUNG GROUP MET US AND WE HAD MORE FUN HERE THAN ANY PLACE THIS FAR - THREE DAYS - WE DROVE NEARLY 300 KM TO ARMENIA - AGAIN THIS STOP WAS MORE FUN THAN BUSINESS. MUST STOP TO GET THIS TO YOU -
