Dear Rhodens-

Here is the Treasury Check for \$62.25 as per attached voucher for per diem within the Federation. The per diem varies as to whether you are in Northern or Southern Rhodesia and also as to whether on ground or air.

We are assuming here that your last voucher for per diem was paid in Nairobi up to midnight on the 27th of February. If there is any discrepancy Washington will straighten it out once all the vouchers are in. We have paid through noon on the 7th of March, by which time you will, Central African Airways willing, have cleared the frontier. You should present this voucher copy to the next Consulate. I believe however that Nairobi is responsible for your expenses in Dar.

I will get on the phone first thing in the morning about your possible refund for family fares within the Federation.

If that comes through I will have them send the check in my name and I'll send you, probably in Cairo, a personal dollar check.

My wife and I regret that we did not see more of you. Would be most interested in your views about the last several days away from Salisbury. The very best to you both and herés for a good & well earned holiday in Europe.
