Gentlemen:

This is in response to your inquiry of April 13, 1982. As you requested, we have reviewed the charge for unmetered service which the Consolidated Edison Company added to your account.

The company has rendered estimated unmetered service charges for the period of December 1, 1976 to December 11, 1981 because your meter did not record all of the service you used during this time.

The company has used your records of actual service as a basis for this computation.

The utility is entitled to render charges for the period your meter did not record. The charges have been computed on a basis we find fair and equitable. Therefore, we must conclude that the charges are proper.

If you wish to make "credit arrangements" to pay this outstanding balance due, present this letter at any local company office within fifteen days to arrange for such terms.
