Gentlemen:

Regarding the shipment of statues delivered today to this gallery from J. Rhoden, 285 Eighth Avenue, New York, as per your bill #B 189520, we wish to report two cases of concealed damage.

Upon uncrating this shipment, we found a piece broken off the bronze sculpture entitled "Angels Teasing Tarus"; also a scraped and torn area on a drawing on paper entitled "Jove".

The value of the sculpture "Angels Teasing Tarus" is \$1000.00; the drawing "Jove" is valued at \$50.00. These are cost prices.

We are having the sculpture glued temporarily in order to be able to place it on exhibition intact, but permanent repair of the damage requires welding by an expert. The drawing is beyond repair, and is therefore a total loss.

We are forwarding a copy of this letter to Mr. Rhoden.
