His wife has followed courses in painting and anthropology here at Columbia, and considers herself a painter. I am told also, that she comes from a well educated family where most of the men are lawyers - John Rohdan is extremely proud of his wife and of her family. All of this simply to tell you a little of what I know about the young man and to recommend him to you.

I take advantage of this letter to send kindest regards to you and to Mr. George Falk. I remember you both with great pleasure and hope that some day I may have occasion to see you again.
