As you know, we were abourd an English Group Ship entrone from Gram, North Africa to Kurschi, India, It was on the 26th of November 1947 at about five P. M. when we were attached by approximately thirty German Bombers that apparently came from Marseille, France. The fighter protection afforded by the British and French was very measure. We wore finally hit by a Winged Bomb which hit just aft of mid-

time I was above deck. Although I did not see your husband from the time the attack started, from all I can find out he was below deck with the enlisted men. It is my simoure belief that your hasband was killed instantly by the terrific coorsector of the book,

I trust that the above is the information which you desire and that it will help to clarify your mind so to what harmened.
