Dear Mr. Rhoden,

You will recall that during your visit in the Federation of Rhodesia and Nyasaland during early March 1956, Central African Airways made a mistake in billing your wife full fare instead of family plan for the return trip Salisbury/Lusaka/Bulawayo/Livingstone/Salisbury.

The Airways subsequently refunded the amount overcharged (£19. 0. 6d.) and I sent my check for \$47.86 to you. The Airways have now informed us that in reviewing our account for that period they have no record of your paying the initial bill of £38. 1. 0d. Would you be good enough to review any receipts or check stubs you may have kept from that period to see if you have a record of the payment in your possession. Our correspondence with the Airways states that you "paid in full" for Mrs. Rhoden's tickets and were seeking reimbursement. I am inclined to think that the Airways accounts are muddled and if you have any receipts it would be the simplest way of straightening things out. Please forward whatever receipt you may have at your earliest convenience.
