




If creative energy is indeed to be found in the tension that separates past from future, old from new, stasis from movement, then America's first institution of the fine arts need look no further than its mission for the strength and inspiration necessary for positive institutional change. This year, even as we have embarked upon a broad-based search for new presidential leadership, the Pennsylvania Academy has

looked to its heritage and to its mission in order to envision its future. Four priorities undertaken in 1998 exemplify the progress that has been made.

First, we are embarked upon an initiative to broaden recognition of our name: *Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts*. This institution's identity as an Academy—a dynamic interaction of a Museum and a School of the Fine Arts—provides a source of renewable energy to propel us forward. The art work alone—as it is exhibited in our galleries, stored in our vaults and created in our studios—offers a limitless source of inspiration. The Women's Committee (WOCO) plays an important leadership role in this outreach effort. In 1998,

WOCO's USArtists Exposition and Sale of American Art broke records for attendance and dollars raised. This year the Women's Committee also established an endowment to bring special needs audiences and students to the Academy.



Secondly, as we have mentioned, the search for a new Chief Executive Officer to lead the Academy into its third century is well under-

way. We are most appreciative of the Search Committee's meticulous efforts. We also want to thank the Board of Trustees, other volunteers, and staff members who have worked so hard during this transitional year. The search for a CEO, while necessarily deliberate, is progressing well.

Third, we are planning an energetic and ambitious exhibition schedule, headed by the most exciting show in recent memory, "Maxfield Parrish, 1870-1966". Parrish will be the region's primary attraction during the summer of 1999. Maxfield Parrish was trained at the Academy. He is considered by many to have been the most popular painter of

the first half of the twentieth century. He was an artistic and technological innovator. There is no more appropriate artist to help reaffirm the influential role of the Academy.

Finally, and perhaps of greatest significance this year, has been our continuing progress in realizing the Academy's dream of a world-class campus in proximity to the historic Furness-designed Academy building. We continue to work closely with private donors, as well as with leaders at the City and State levels, to finalize plans for a most exciting addition to Philadelphia's Avenue of the Arts.

We trust that your perusal of this report will provide a sense of just what a special place this is. We hope it will help those who have not already done so to become a part of this unique and exciting organization. A group of 71 prominent national leaders, organized by Peale, his son Rembrandt and sculptor William Rush, establish the Academy, Celebrated American painter, Benjamin West, President of the Royal Academy in London, accepts the Academy's first award of "Honorary Academician". In their application to the Commonwealth for a Charter, the founders describe the organization's purpose as "exciting the efforts of the artist gradually to unfold, enlighten and invigorate the talents of our countrymen."

Academy emissary Nicholas Biddle travels to Paris to arrange for the purchase from the Louvre

(for instructional purposes) of an array of casts made from antique and renaissance sculptures in that collection.

1812

Emperor Napoleon donates 24 volumes of classical engravings.

1845

The Academy's Annual Report is issued, observing that "pecuniary affairs are in flourishing condition." Nine days later, fire ravages the building. Miraculously, most of the collection is saved, including Benjamin West's Death on the Pale Horse.

Abolitionist theologian William Henry Furness, the architect's father, dedicates the acclaimed new Academy building "that draws upon the beautiful arts to gladden and elevate the hearts of man." Faculty member

Joseph Fraser is engaged to run the summer program at Chester Springs, now thriving in its 15th year with a distinguished faculty including N.C. Wyeth. Fraser will become Director of the Academy in 1936 and remain in the post for 33 years. During this era, the role of the "art academy" will come into question as artists and

Villiam Mervitt Chase more avant-garde perspective, and museums such as the Whitney Museum of American Art, the Philadelphia Museum of Art and the Museum of Modern Art became prominent. Fraser is an enormous force in cementing a oneto-one pedagogical tradition, further refining the apprenticeship model that had been developing since the time of Thomas Eakins. The goal can in fact be traced to Peale: to learn from existing works of art, and to

transform inspired art students into inspired artists and, in turn, into inspired teachers.



Horace Pippin

1946

Self-taught African-American artist Horace Pippin accepts the J. Henry Schiedt Memorial Prize at the 141st Academy Annual Exhibition. Fortyeight years later in 1994, the definitive retrospective of Pippin's works, organized by the Academy, will open in Philadelphia and tour the nation.

1950

Henry Drinker gives a large collection of the work of his famous aunt Cecilia Beaux, who was trained and exhibited often at the Academy. The Women's Committee is established.

Alexander Calder

Docent Vice-President Anne-Elizabeth McCollum with a school group in front of Benjamin West's Death on the Pale Horse.

1962

The Academy purchases Route Barrée, a mobile by the renowned third generation sculptor Alexander Calder, whose grandfather, father and mother were all Academy students.

Two years later Mrs. Harrison will donate Peale's self-portrait, An Artist in His Museum, as well as Penn's Treaty with the Indians by Benjamin West. In 1880, the Temple Fund will be established, income from which is for acquisitions. In 1891, Mr. Gibson will leave the largest bequest to the Academy until that of collector John W. Merriam one hundred vears later.

year, the Academy's Annual Exhibition draws 5,034 visitors in one day. Two years later, on the occasion of the Academy's Centennial, distinguished faculty member William Merritt Chase will call the Academy "the most important art institution in the world."

1908

More than a quarter of a million people visit during the year, which is highlighted by the renowned exhibition entitled "The Eight." This ground-breaking effort explores the modern realism associated with the Ashcan School. Five members of The Eight, Robert Henri, John Sloan, William Glackens, George Luks and Everett Shinn, are former

Andew Wyeth's exhibition draws large crowds and national media attention.

1969

The Annual Exhibition is discontinued. Committed Board members continue to ensure annual operating viability. Mr. and Mrs. Henry S. McNeil, Ambassador and Mrs. Walter Annenberg, and Mr. and Mrs. Samuel M. V. Hamilton advocate for an extensive restoration of the Academy building.

1974

The building is closed for a two-year restoration overseen by Hyman Myers. The international re-discovery of Furness as an important architect is reflected by the publication of two major books on his work, as well as by a major exhibition at the Philadelphia Museum of Art.

1976

The restored Academy building, now officially designated a National Historic Landmark, is re-opened as part of the Nation's Bicentennial Celebration.

Red Grooms

1985

Charles Bregler's collection of Eakins is purchased. The Red Grooms exhibition brings 90,000 visitors. An endowment for acquisitions is established by the family of Henry S.

McNeil. The fund purchases the Academy's first painting by John Singleton Copley.

1996

"To Be Modern: American Encounters with Cézanne and Company" is the perfect complement to the summer's historic Cézanne exhibition at the Philadelphia Museum of Art.
Philadelphia is established as a destination for fine arts-oriented vacationers. Plans are initiated to expand the Pennsylvania Convention Center with a Broad Street entrance directly opposite the Academy.

1998

Private donors and city and state leaders are engaged in a process to create a much larger, state of the art

Academy facility adjacent to the historic Museum building. Numerous cultural and corporate partners participate in preparations for an

historic retrospective of the work of Academy-trained artist Maxfield Parrish. The Academy establishes a national alumni association.

1999

A comprehensive promotional effort of the Parrish show aligns the participation of the Philadelphia Convention and Visitors Bureau, Greater Philadelphia Tourism and Marketing Corporation, Philadelphia Newspapers, Inc., regional hotels, WHYY and other electronic media to make Parrish the hit of the summer.




