EXHIBITIONS

2)

The 137th Annual Exhibition of Painting and Sculpture was held in the Galleries from January 25 through March 1,1942, with a Private View on Saturday afternoon, January 24 from three to five-thirty. This change in precedent from an evening preview to the afternoon, was necessitated by "blackout" regulations issued through the Office of Civilian Defense.

An Exhibition of the Work of Mary Butler was held in the Galleries from March 7 through March 29,1942 (Gals. A. and B) with a Opening Tea on March 7th from 3 to 5 P. M. Concurrent with this Exhibition was an Exhibition of recent acquisitions from the Academy's Print Collection in Galleries L and M and exhibit cases containing material covering the various processes in the making of etchings, woodcuts, and lithographs.

The Fellowship Annual Exhibition of Water Colors and Prints was held in Galleries B,C, and D from March 14 to 29,1942, opening with a Tea on March 14th from 3 to 5 P. M.

The Fellowship Annual Exhibition of Oil Painting and Sculpture was held in Galleries A,B, C, and D from April 5 through 19,1942 opening

with a Tea on April 5th from 3 to 5 P. M.

During both of these Exhibitions, the Permanent Collection was on view in the remaining Galleries.

An Exhibition of Prints by Students of the Academy was held in Gallery C from May 14 through the 31st,1942.

The Student Exhibition held in conjunction with the competition for the Cresson Traveling Scholarships was on view in Galleries C,D,E,F,G, the Rotunda and West Central Galleries from May 20th through June 9,1942, opening with exercises for the students and their friends on the afternoon of May 20th at 4 o'clock.

An Exhibition entitled "Soldiers of Production" procured through the Office of Emergency Management, Section of Fine Arts, Washington, D. C. was held in Gallery K from May 20th through June 21,1942. This Exhibition included the paintings and drawings by eight American Artists appointed by the O.E.M. to record activities in specific defense areas; and the artists represented were Howard Cook, David Fredenthal, George Harding, Mitchell Jamieson, Richard Jansen, Carlos Lopez, Reginald Marsh and Ogden Pleissner.

During the summer months all of the Galleries were hung with selections from the Permanent Collection and were dismantled on October 15,1942 to prepare for the hanging of the 40th Annual Water Color and Print Exhibition and the 41st Annual Exhibition of Miniatures.

The 40th Annual Water Color and Print Exhibition, and the 41st Annual Exhibition of Miniatures were hung in all of the Galleries with the exception of Galleries G,H,I,K and the West Central Gallery from October 25th through November 29th, 1942, opening with a Private View on Saturday afternoon, October 24th, from 3 to 5:30 P.M.

Starting on November 30,1942, the Galleries have remained closed on Mondays.

SCHOOLS

The Winter School session not being co-incident in dates with this Annual Report, a general statement is made reporting successfully active departments with good physical conditions.

The Chester Springs Summer School was not opened in the season of 1942, due to War conditions, and will probably remain closed for the duration.

BUILDING

Main Building, Broad and Cherry Streets and Annex, 1834 Arch Street

No major renovations were necessary at Broad and Cherry Streets or at 1834 Arch Street, and only general maintenance and normal repairs were accomplished.

Chester Springs, Pennsylvania

Men from the basement crew accomplished the painting of the outside of the tenant houses and the second floor interior of the Faculty Building in the spring of 1942.

GENERAL

5) Due to War conditions and the possibility of enemy attack, a group of 54 objects, 46 paintings and 8 pieces of sculpture, deemed as the most precious of the Academy's possessions were moved from the premises at Broad and Cherry Sts. to the vaults of the Fidelity-Philadelphia Trust Company at Broad and Walnut Sts.

As additional protection to its pictures remaining in the basement vaults at Broad and Cherry Sts., insofar as their size would allow, the best were rearranged so that they would hang in the upper row of two rows now employed in our storage vaults. At the time of making this rearrangement, the entire Permanent Collection of paintings were reclassified according to country and artist and all of the vaults re-organized on this program. This adjustment involved the complete examination of all of our card filing system and disclosed many incomplete records. Work has been begun to bring all of these records to date with as accurate knowledge as can be procured. This work is not completely finished at the time of the making of this Report.

A special note is included that from January 28,1942 to date the publicity has been in the hands of Campbell-Wirtz Associates of 329 Walnut St., Philadelphia.

The Curator of Prints, Miss Bertha von Moschzisker, resigned on October 19,1942, to enter Defense Work.

Mr. George Harding and Mr. Walker Hancock entered the Service in the summer of 1942

The Curator of Schools, Mr. Henry Hotz, Jr., entered the Navy in June, 1942, and Miss Dorothy A. Jones was appointed Acting Curator.

It is with regret that we note the death of Mr. Henry McCarter, on November 20,1942. Mr. McCarter was an instructor for 40 years at the Academy.

6) LIBRARY

The Librarian reports the purchase of 14 volumes at a cost of \$39.65, and the receipt of 27 volumes through gifts.

The clipping file on artists has been continued through the year, 1942, as has also the reference file of photographs of animals and miscellaneous subjects, supplemented by newspaper and magazine clippings.

7) PRINT COLLECTION

The Print Collection purchased 31 prints and 1 book, and was given 141 prints and 2 books illustrated with woodcuts.

The thanks of the Management of the Academy are extended to the President and members of the Board of Education for sending promising students to our Schools; and to the newspapers for their intelligent critisms and general inclusion of items of news relative to the Academy.

Acknowledgement is also made to all the employees of the Academy for the faithful performance of their duties.
