The making of dienes, platters, boxes and spoons from the vine maple, the outer back of hericak, and alder, we made the handler for the boxes from elerder cedar bound which we twisted intexexper ropelike. At our winterting letoure we fethers often nade bows and arrows for themselves and for their yours sore. The hows were rade of yours white or gedor, or of yew and virenaple. The arrows pere made of coder or Moxaginal with bone points. The quivers in which we kept our arrows were made of knexxeking a single skin of molf or wildest. Often on a winters evening while stories were being told a few men would be whittling paddles for their caroes. Insulanantegranding rearests as morrowing a different type of paddlex was made for the different types of travel, scean, River, and ordinary travel, we spent a great Agel of time in the carvirs of our cances from the tall red order. Also, we carefully rended our cedar canons when necessary by drilling. a pair of holes along the splittand passing and tieing codar linb withes or root tarough them. Then we made the seams watertight by gnearing pitch. We were not a magneful people, we mended things as they became broken and we intranspress took care of the food that rature hastowed or us.

Shenever a house had to be raised the whole village turned out to help build it. So one was poid but everyone was fed. The central bears, to our course were finely fifthed and painted with pictures of the guardian spirits of the owners of the house. in the front of the house a right elettors with a clark scar wer built where wen of the willinge would gather to gazzig discuss local happenings, mere the sen gat to match the earth . This platforn was also used as a work area, by side the house, a eleming platform extended around the four sides. A wide shelf was suspended three feet below the caves of the house wherethe dried fish and rest were stored. Although we kept a fire burnibe in our houses, we often had occasion to use a fire drill, this we made from a single shaft of alder root which was twirled between the pairs, when mafely started the fire was farmed with the wine or tail of an eagle, we kept our fire drill in a mandbag that we made of coall cedar bark note main were larged torether. "Ithough we lived in a simple now each small object that we made may deporated in a finished namer. we always had wild aminals for pets, pheasants, sawbill ducks, bears, beaver, couger, clk, seal, sea otter, permot and of course deer. These apins is more taken when they were young and kept till they were grown and they they were turned loose, ar insig that we kept as pets were never killed for food.
