# EXHIBITIONS

The 138th Annual Exhibition of Painting and Sculpture was held in the galleries from January 24th through February 28th,1943, with a Private View on Saturday afternoon, January 23rd from 3 to 5:30 P. M.

The Fellowship Annual Exhibition of Water Colors and Prints was held in Galleries C and D from March 7 to March 21,1943, opening with a Tea on March 6th from 3 to 5 P. M.

The Fellowship Annual Exhibition of Oil Painting and Sculpture was held in Galleries A,B,C, and D from March 28 to April 11, opening with a Tea on March 27, from 3 to 5 P. M.

During both of these Exhibitions the Permanent Collection was on view in the remaining Galleries.

An Exhibition of Inter-American Photographs, obtained through the Pan-American Union, was held from April 8 -25th in three galleries, including the work of 200 photographers of 18 of the American Republics selected as a result of National competition under the auspices of the Pan-American Union and was possibly the largest and most comprehensive assembly of Inter-American photographic Art ever shown.

Gallery M was hung with 37 chiaroscuros from the Academy's Print Collection, and Gallery A with 30 etchings by Rembrandt from the Academy's Print Collection, and Gallery N with 9 War posters by Norman Rockwell, Anton Otto Fischer, Robert Sloan, E. McKnight Kauffer and B. Perlin on April 26th.

A Special Exhibition of Naval Defense Activities - Drawings and Water Colors by Vernon Howe Bailey was on view from April 11 - May 2,1943. This Exhibition was procured through the Office of Public Relations

The Student Exhibition held in conjunction with the Competition for the William Emlen Cresson Traveling Scholarships was on view in Galleries D,E,F, from May 20th through June 6,1943, opening with exercises for the students and their friends on the afternoon of May 19, at 4 P. M.

During the summer months all of the Galleries were hung with selections from the Permanent Collection and were dismantled on October 11th to prepare for the hanging of the 41st Annual Water Color and Print Exhibition and the 42nd Annual Exhibition of Miniatures.

The 41st Annual Water Color and Print Exhibition and the 42nd Annual Exhibition of Miniatures were hung in all of the Galleries with the exception of Galleries G,H,I,K, and the West Central Gallery from October 24th through November 28th, opening with a Private View on Saturday afternoon, October 23rd, from 3 to 5:30 P. M.

An Exhibition of British American War Cartoons, sponsored by the English-Speaking Union was hung in Gallery F from November 24th through December 5th, opening with a Tea on November 23rd, and a dinner that evening for the members of the English-Speaking Union in the Academy's Gallery G.

A Memorial Exhibition of the work of Henry McCarter was held in Galleries C,D,E, and F from December 12 through January 9,1944, opening with a Tea on December 11th from 3 to 5:30 P. M.

#### Main Building, Broad and Cherry Streets and Annex, 1834 Arch Street

No major renovations were necessary at Broad and Cherry Streets or at 1834 Arch Street, and only general maintenance and normal repairs were accomplished.

#### Chester Springs, Pennsylvania
