In response to a telephone conversation I had with Mr Bellini of your department ~~on 3/18/69~~ I am giving the following information with regard to Section 9 of the above Contract:

Without any notification being given to me, the sculpture for the new Harlem Medical Center was taken from the Modern Arts Foundry on March 4th, 1969 and erected on the building on March 5th; two days later I had a telephone call from Modern Art Foundry advising me that the sculpture was on the building and I immediately went up to the Hospital and saw it and made an appointment for it to be adjusted. This appointment was made for ~~the morning of March 12th~~ the morning of March 12th; at ~~about~~ the piece was brought forward ~~one~~ one and a half inches, although I actually wanted it brought forward six inches, the riggers said that they couldnot do this because of the strain on the steel pins. Mr John Spring of Modern Arts Foundry says that within the next five days he will send workmen to the site to clean up and polish down the sculpture.
